21:30 **Signal Hill**

Signal Hill is the Northern tip of the terrestrial area of the Table Mountain National Park, connecting Kloof Nek to Lion's Head. It is one of the most famous spots in Cape Town for sundowners. From Signal Hill's peak which is 350m high, one can enjoy spectacular views, especially at night.

The Signal Hill is also known as Lion's Rump, as it is attached to Lion's Head by a 'spine' of hills.

With thousands of locals and tourists coming over to enjoy the exceptional view of the Sunset over the Atlantic; Signal Hill is a little like lovers' lane and a trendy sundowner venue. In the evenings, the views from the summit are breathtaking.

08:30 **Depart** via Franschoek to **Babylonstoren Wine Estate** (100km)

Franschhoek is a town with centuries-old vineyards and Cape Dutch architecture. Trails wind through flowers and wildlife at Mont Rochelle Nature Reserve to views over Franschhoek Valley. The Huguenot Memorial Museum and neighbouring monument honour the area's French settlers, who arrived in the 17th and 18th centuries.

10:00 **Babylonstoren Wine Estate**

You will enjoy the guided **walk in the gardens** and **wine tasting**.

This traditional Cape Dutch working wine and fruit farm is surrounded by the mountains of the Drakenstein valley, where nomadic Khoisan communities used to roam for centuries. French Huguenot, Pieter van der Byl, was granted Babylonstoren in 1692. The first vineyards were planted and the original buildings were constructed on the farm.

In the current history of Babylonstoren, the first harvest was celebrated on 11 January 2011 with Chardonnay forming the base wine and come 11 January 2012 saw the farm celebrated the start of 2012 harvest and one year anniversary of winemaking in the cellar.



The garden is the pride and joy of this farm with only medicinal and edible plants. You will find yourself in a magical wonderland of indigenous herbs, 7 000 clivias in spring, 48 pergolas of climbing roses and fruit trees.

12:30 Depart to **Stellenbosch**

Stellenbosch is a popular tourist destination due to its history as the second oldest town in South Africa (dating back to 1679), its many historic buildings that are typical of Cape Dutch architecture, its location in the centre of many famous wine farms, as well as its variety of cafes, restaurants, boutiques and art galleries. The town is home to the University of Stellenbosch, one of South Africa's oldest universities, whose campus and buildings occupies large swathes of the town centre.

13:30 Lunch: **Wijnhuis Restaurant**

Wijnhuis is a renowned restaurant in Stellenbosch's historic town centre. It has recently undergone a significant renovation, providing a relaxed dining experience surrounded by beautiful artworks. The restaurant offers a regularly updated, diverse all-day menu.
